






Through this in-house magazine, I would like to share a couple of highlights during last quarter (Q1): -

I am pleased to inform that SCMS has entered an MoU with the Singrauli District Administration and Govt. ITI, Singrauli, Madhya Pradesh on 4th May 2023 for the execution of the SANKALP (Skill Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion) Scheme of the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, GoI. Under this MoU, 510 local unemployed candidates of the Singrauli district shall be trained and certified in job roles like Dumper/Tipper Operator, Mine Mechanic/Fitter, HEMM Mechanic, Mine Electrician, and Mine Welder.

Another feather in the SCMS's cap is signing an MOU with Vivekanand Polytechnic Sitasaongi, Bhandara (Maharashtra) on 9th May, 2023 to align mining related -NSQF job roles for diploma mining students.

Members would appreciate that the MOIL-CSR sponsored training for a special batch of 30 female candidates for the job role "Rig Mounted Drill Operator" which was commenced on 3rd Jan 2023 has also been successfully completed in April 2023 wherein all the trainees are certified. Currently they are undergoing apprenticeship training at Awarpur Cement Works, Maharashtra, Hirmi Cement Works & Rawan Cement Works, Chhattisgarh.

On the training front, SCMS has certified 938 candidates under STT & RPL and happy to share that we have active galaxy of 66 Trainers & 18 Master Trainers with 201 certifications and 38 Assessors & 19 Master Assessors with 181 certifications.

I had a privilege to attend Odisha Skill Conclave held in Bhubaneswar from 20-22 April 2023 where in as a part of co-panelists, during the "Focused Group Discussions- a special session with select sector skill councils to highlight on the importance, requirement, and relevance of SSCs in today's skilling ecosystem" I shared my thoughts. 

India's coal production grows 7.10% to 76.26 million tonne in May

Domestic coal production was 7.10 per cent higher year-on-year at 76.26 million tonne (MT) in May. India had produced 71.21 MT coal during the same month in 2022, the coal ministry said in a statement. "Ministry of Coal has achieved a remarkable feat with a substantial surge in overall coal production during May 23, reaching 76.26 MT surpassing May 22 of 71.21 MT, representing an increase of 7.10 per cent," it said.

The cumulative coal production in April-May FY24 jumped to 149.41 MT from 138.41 MT in the year-ago period. Last month, Coal India Ltd (CIL) alone produced 59.94 MT coal, up 9.54 per cent over 54.72 MT in May 2022. With an increased first-mile connectivity infrastructure, coal dispatch last month grew 5.70 per cent to 82.22 MT from 77.79 MT in May 2022. First-mile connectivity refers to the transportation of coal from pitheads to dispatch points.

The cumulative coal dispatch in April-May FY24 stood at 162.44 MT as against 149.76 MT in the year-ago period. This upturn in offtake has resulted in a comfortable coal stock position, guaranteeing reliable and abundant supply of coal lying at pithead coal stock at CIL, SCCL, stock at TPP(DCB) etc, the ministry said. The total coal stock as of May 31, 2023 is 112.41 MT as compared to 82.97 MT on May 31, 2022, a growth of 35.48 per cent. The coal stock position has strengthened the capability to tackle unforeseen fluctuations in energy demand and ensures meeting the energy demands of the nation. The availability of coal rakes for coal transportation has remained consistently good throughout this period due to the initiative taken by the ministry to augment rail connectivity infrastructure under PM Gati Shakti.

Coal Sector fully prepared to Meet Growing Domestic Demand- Minister Pralhad Joshi

Union Minister of Coal, Mines & Parliamentary Affairs Shri Pralhad Joshi assured the country that even during the coming monsoon season there will be no shortage of coal. India's coal sector is fully prepared to meet the enhanced domestic demand of our fast growing economy, he stated.

Addressing a high level Conference & Exhibition on the theme "Underground Coal Mining – Way Forward for Sustainable Energy Security", organized by Coal India Limited (CIL), Ministry of Coal, Shri Pralhad Joshi urged CIL to emerge as coal exporter in the next 2-3 years. The Minister Complemented Coal India Limited and its subsidiaries for achieving record coal production and said that sustainable mining needs to be ensured while working towards Aatmanirbhar India in coal sector. Shri Joshi urged to ensure safety in coal mines with utmost priority while focusing on stepped up production.

Even as the world economy is going through a slowdown, India has emerged as a bright spot as one of the fastest growing economies globally, the Minister pointed out. Shri Joshi further stated that internationally India's credibility has increased substantially in the recent years and the country has emerged as world's factory. He called upon the coal sector to devise suitable action plans to meet the growing energy requirements of the country in coming years. The Minister appreciated the new initiatives and reforms undertaken by the Coal Ministry to enhance commercial coal mining. 87 coal blocks have been successfully auctioned under commercial auction and some of them have already started production, he said.

Coal imports not needed from next fiscal: Pralhad Joshi

India will not need to import thermal coal from the next financial year owing to ample domestic availability, coal and mines minister Pralhad Joshi said on 7th June, 2023. "There is no shortage of coal in the country and there will be no need to import thermal coal from fiscal 2024-25," Joshi told ET on the sidelines of a press conference to mark major achievements of his ministries.

The minister also said that India aims to auction 500 mineral blocks by 2025-26. "We have made changes to the mining regime to encourage more auctions," he said. According to Joshi, India will close the current financial year with 880 million metric tonnes of coal production, 14% higher than the last fiscal.

India is the second largest importer of the fuel despite having the fourth largest coal reserves in the world, according to official estimates. Though coal imports saw a decline in 2020-21 and 2021-22, a fifth of the country's annual coal requirement is being met through imported fuel. "We are also supporting a pilot project of small scale to demonstrate financial and technological aspects," said M Nagaraju, additional secretary, coal ministry. "We are ready for another peak power demand. Currently we have 116 million metric tonnes of coal with the public sector undertakings and with the thermal power plants, which is 29% higher than last year," Joshi said. IIT ISM Dhanbad launches skill development programme for youth

On 17th April, 2023, IIT Indian School of Mines (ISM) Dhanbad launched three-month long skill development programme for the role of assistant mine surveyor course wherein around 300 local youths will be trained.

Dhanbad MP PN Singh while addressing the function as chief guest said that skill development not only helps in increasing the efficiency of workers but also averts accidents in different sectors including mining. Singh said unskilled displaced people from mining projects get jobs in mining companies in lieu of their land. If they possess the required skills in their relevant field of work they would do better, he added. He lauded the effort of IIT ISM for providing skill development training not only to the wage earners of the institution but also to other unemployed young people in order to enhance their skills.

IIT ISM director Prof Rajiv Shekhar while addressing the programme through online mode claimed that IIT ISM became the first institution in the country which has launched skill development training under Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojna (PMKVY 4.0).

IIT ISM deputy director Prof Dhiraj Kumar on the occasion shed light on the background of the training programme and said that on the directive of the ministry of skill development, skill-enhancing training is being given to 300 unskilled persons. "Besides experts of IIT ISM, retired surveyor of Bharat Coking Coal Limited and other mining companies would also impart the training," he said.

Tech skills shortage an existential threat to the global mining industry

In a presentation on the findings in the report on June 7, PwC Africa energy, utilities and resources partner Vuyiswa Khutlang said mining companies needed to attract more workers, particularly those with technological skills, to achieve their strategic objectives. Unfortunately, however, many potential skilled workers do not see the industry as attractive. She said the top 40 mining companies surveyed needed to rethink their workforce strategies to appeal to a wider group of employees.

According to the report, attracting the industry's next generation of talent requires a focus on the industry's "skills of the future", which are in artificial intelligence, robotics, automation and data analytics. In a survey by the Mining Industry Human Resources Council of Canada, 70% of 15- to 30-year-olds said they would not consider a career in mining – the highest proportion of all industries. PwC's Mine report showed that up to two-thirds of mining CEOs believed skill shortages would have either a large or a very large impact on profitability in the next ten years.

According to a study from the World Economic Forum, 73% of mining companies see local skills gaps as the biggest barrier to adopting new technology, which would not replace the need for humans in mining but would lead to the industry becoming more transparent, with improved efficiencies, safety and carbon footprints. For example, the number of autonomous haul trucks in operation globally grew by 39% in the year to May 2022, from 769 to 1 068.

"To meet the demand for these skill sets, leaders must look beyond the traditional mining talent pool and retrain existing workers," Khutlang noted. With regard to targeting technology skills, the PwC report says that attracting the talent needed at tech-enabled mining sites will require several new approaches. First, there will be a need to invest in education at both an on-site and community level to attract and retain talent who can be trained, reskilled or transferred.

Second, mining companies should collaborate more with governments, industry and peers on policy advocacy for issues such as the migration of skilled workers and support for remote mining communities to attract talent and fulfill workforce requirements. Third, investment in communications is key to highlighting the industry's role in the energy transition and its use of technology to change the way miners mine, which could help address the perception of mining as environmentally harmful, physically demanding, hazardous and remote.

"As it is, though, some workers lack confidence that even their current employers are training them in the use of technology," Khutlang said. In PwC's Global Workforce Hopes and Fears Survey of 2022, 38% of workers at metals and mining companies said they were concerned about not getting sufficient training in digital and technology skills from their employer.

In addition to pushing technology skills development, the Mine report says it is important for the mining industry to drive diversity, equity and inclusion. PwC says a diverse and inclusive culture is critical for attracting talent, as inclusive companies benefit from diversity of experience and diversity of thinking, which are two valuable qualities in an industry undergoing change. In the mining industry, however, the survey found that diversity is still lacking across a wide range of workforce characteristics.

Khutlang said it was necessary for mining companies to understand the state of diversity, equity and inclusion in their businesses by gathering data and creating transparency with stakeholders. "Embrace technology to remove barriers brought about by the remote location of many mine sites and allow a more accessible working environment," she said. The PwC report recommends building a strategy that highlights diversity and inclusion as a priority and embeds it throughout the organisation. Moreover, effort should be made to generate buy-in from leaders throughout the business to ensure that the tone at the top is aligned with the stated purpose, Khutlang said. FLASHES FROM OVERSEAS

US, India launch working group on education and skill development

India and the United States have launched a working group on education and skill development which is expected to give a big boost to people-to-people relationship. Held in a hybrid format, the first meeting of the US-India Education and Skills Development Working Group was hosted by the State Department's Assistant Secretary for the Bureau of South and Central Asia, Donald Lu, here along with the Ministry of Education's Joint Secretary of International Cooperation, Neeta Prasad in New Delhi. The working group exchanged perspectives on skill development and vocational education, certification and recognition, partnerships between US and Indian higher educational institutions, and engaging with the private sector.

Participants also discussed ways to further expand the educational linkages and collaborate on the promotion of the workforce development, an official US release said. Noting that student and faculty exchanges are at the heart of knowledge partnership between both the countries, the Indian side highlighted the need for expeditious visa issuance and reaffirmed their ongoing efforts on this issue.

During the meeting, Lu stressed the importance of these educational connections to our shared economic prosperity and said the US and India enjoy strong people-to-people ties in large part due to the numerous Indian students and faculty in the United States, and the growing network of educational exchanges. The establishment of the India-US Working Group on Education and Skill Development was announced by the two countries on the sidelines of the 2+2 Ministerial Dialogue held in Washington DC last year.

The launch focused on skilling and vocational education, certification and recognition, matchmaking between the US and Indian higher educational institutions, and engaging with the private sector to strengthen the organic synergies that exist mutually. During the meeting, the two delegations emphasised the significance of certification and recognition mechanisms in ensuring quality and portability of skills across borders. The Indian side explained the importance of mutual recognition of academic qualifications and skill certifications which is essential for smooth mobility of students and professionals between the two countries. Recognising the potential for collaboration in the field of higher education, the delegations discussed the importance of matchmaking between higher educational institutions of India and the US, a media release said.

Officials also acknowledged the benefits of promoting student and faculty exchanges, joint research programs, and collaborative projects between universities and colleges of both countries. They agreed to encourage and facilitate such partnerships to foster academic and cultural exchange, enhance educational quality, and promote innovation and knowledge-sharing. Both sides agreed to encourage greater inter-linkages amongst the educational institutions. The Indian side proposed that developing joint/dual and twinning courses in areas of mutual interest could be explored, the Indian release added.

India is looking to mine oceans, which will unlock huge opportunities and new areas of operations for Indian industries, mines secretary Vivek Bharadwaj said. Speaking at a conference on the sidelines of the silver jubilee edition of the International Engineering & Technology Fair 2023, the mines secretary said that the government is amending the Offshore Areas Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, which is open for comments from the industry.

"We need to increase domestic exploration and we have enlisted 13 private exploration companies as the opportunities are immense. We also need to look at acquiring foreign assets. We sent a team to Argentina to identify mines for investments and we have two lithium mines and one copper mine there. Within the

coming period, we will shortlist projects to invest, which will be open to the private sector," Bhardwaj said. He also urged the industry to get into organized recycling to make India the recycling hub of the world.

Talking about the opportunities and possibilities in metals and mining industry, he said that the government has proposed amendments in the MMDR Act to encourage junior miners. Koushik Chatterjee, chairman, Metal & Metallurgy Expo 2023 and executive director and Group CFO, Tata Steel Ltd said metals and metallurgy sector is the foundation of India's economic growth and underlined the need to develop a sustainable metals and metallurgy Industry, which is aligned with India's Sustainable Development and Net-Zero goals.

Gajendra Panwar, MD, Danieli India Ltd said that the industry should build modern steel plants capable of delivering premium quality steel to become globally competitive. Noting that India needs to become carbon neutral, he said that green hydrogen is a great option to bring down greenhouse gases emissions. "But, until it is available and affordable, we must look for other technologies to use natural gases to bring down carbon emissions," he added.

Sunil Duggal, chairman CII National Committee on Mining and Group CEO, Vedanta Ltd said that the enormous potential of the mining and metallurgy sector needs to be unlocked and added that the industry is fully committed to achieve Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision to make India Aatmanirbhar in coming years. Over 400 companies from 19 countries are displaying their latest products and technologies at the IETF. Finland is the focus country at the IETF this year.

India, Singapore agree to make knowledge, skill development key pillar of strategic partnership

India and Singapore agreed to create opportunities for lifelong learning, building a future-ready workforce, and making knowledge and skill development a key pillar of strategic partnership, according to the Ministry of Education. Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan is on a three-day visit to Singapore to strengthen existing ties and to explore the possibility of widening the scope of bilateral engagement in education and skill development.

Pradhan met various key ministers of the Singapore Government and visited Spectra Secondary School on 29th May, 2023. "Pradhan had a constructive meeting with Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance, Singapore, Lawrence Wong on strengthening the existing cooperation between India and Singapore with a focus on deepening engagements in skill development," the ministry said in a statement.

"During the meeting, it was agreed to work together, aiming to create opportunities for lifelong learning, building a future-ready workforce, and making knowledge and skill development a key pillar of strategic partnership," it added. Later in the day, Pradhan visited Spectra Secondary School and interacted with the students as well as teachers to know more about the teaching-learning environment and pedagogy, among others.



He also emphasized incorporating the training materials of the corporates which are non-competitive differentiators, into the skilling ecosystem. He further shared that Time-sharing based Centre of Excellence (CoEs) are being planned.

Dr. K.K. Dwivedi, Joint Secretary, MSDE, emphasized that the Sector Skill Councils (SSCs) should focus on increasing the fee-based programs training numbers. Suggestions have been welcomed from SSCs on the Business model for the sustainability of SSCs.
